#### Alder Glade Farm

Alder Glade farm was part of the Donation Land Claim of Thomas L. Coon, who immigrated to Oregon in 1850. His wife and daughter crossed the plains in 1852. Thomas died in January of 1854. It is believed that he was buried on the property along with two other persons. There were three graves in the fence row north of the Coon house that was built in the early 1850s. The graves were still on the property in 1916 when John and Mollie Markland Davenport purchased the property from Charles F. Hicks; the owner of the property at that time. Some of the property was sold to Charles Meyers to give him access to a spring for water. That left the Davenports with 85.21 acres of land.

Grandfather John was born 26 April 1874, to Benjamin and Lucretia Dewitt Davenport on the Davenport Donation Land Claim. He was the grandson of Dr. Benjamin and Sarah Gott Davenport who were pioneers in 1851. Grandmother Mollie Markland Davenport was born 3 February 1877, to Taylor and Jennie Johnson Markland. Mollie was a teacher in many of the grade schools before her marriage to John Davenport 23 October 1909.

John and Mollie raised sheep, Jersey cattle, chickens, and hogs. They grew hay, grain, and corn to feed the livestock. Eggs and cream were sold off the farm. The farm ground was worked with horses until 1949 when our grandparents moved from the farm and handed the operation over to their son, Henry, and his wife Eloise Ebbert Davenport. Henry was born 11 December 1911, and married Eloise 28 May 1938. Eloise was the granddaughter of pioneers George W. and Elizabeth Landis Ebbert. She was born 26 May 1917.

Henry and Eloise moved onto the farm in June of 1949 with their four children Ann, John, Ken and Earl. The children were involved in 4H and FFA. They raised hay and grain for the livestock. The livestock consisted of a registered Border Cheviot flock and Milking Shorthorn cattle. The Border Cheviots were one of the first flocks in Oregon. They were shown at many fairs up and down the West Coast. A stud ram was imported from Scotland and many Cheviots were purchased in Canada, Australia, and across the United States to improve the flock.

Ken and Earl Davenport took over the operation when Henry and Eloise were no longer able to handle the everyday operations of the farm. Ken was born 22 September 1947, and Earl was born 11 January 1949. Ken married Sharon Mattison 10 May 1980. They raise hay for the cattle and sheep. A commercial flock of mixed breed ewes and a flock of registered Border Cheviots are raised on the farm. Wagyu Cattle are also part of the operation.

The shop, barn, and sheep shed were built shortly after the purchase of Alder Glade farm by John and Mollie Davenport in 1916. The barn and sheep shed have been remodeled over the years to fit the needs of different operations. Other buildings were built in that time period but were lost in the Columbus Day Storm in 1961.

THIS AGREEMENT MADE, this 23rd day of August, 1916 by and between Charles F. Hicks, party of the first part and Charles Meyer and John Davenport, parties of the second part, all of Marion County, State of Oregon.

WITNESSETH, that for and in consideration of the sum of Seventy-six (\$76.00) Dollars per acre said party of the first part hereby agrees to sell and convey unto said parties of the second part a certain 147.46 acre tract of land more particularly described in a Certificate of Title, recorded in Marion County, Oregon records, Vol. 2 folium 86, No. 608 records of Certificate of Title.

It is further agreed by and between all parties hereto that said parties of the second part are to divide said land on or before # days after date at a division line heretofore agreed upon by said parties of the second part each paying for the part he receives at the rate per acre above specified.

It is further agreed that said John Davenport is to pay \$2,000.00 on or before October 1st, 1916 and the balance of his portion of the purchase price on or before five years after date, bearing interest at the rate of 60 per annum payable annually, and said Charles Meyer is to pay \$4,000.00 on or before march 30th, 1917 and the talance of the purchase price of his portion of said lands on or before five years after date, bearing interest at the rate of 60 per annum, payable annually.

It is hereby agreed and understood that as soon as said land is surveyed and divided that said party of the first will execute deeds to said property to said parties of the second part according to the survey made and deposit the same in a Bank in Silverton, Oregon to be delivered upon said parties

making the payments as above provided, said parties, hereby agreeing to make mortgages for the balance of each pruchase price as above provided and place them with said deeds to be delivered at the time said deeds are delivered.

It is further agreed that said parties of the second part are to deposit in the Bank with said deeds sufficient securities to guarantee said party of the first part that said cash payments shall be paid as above provided.

Said parties of the second part further agree to pay the taxes which become due and payable on said premises in the spring of 1917.

"Thomas Lewis Coon, an 1850 pioneer, passed away Jan. 10, 1854 at his home in Silverton, at the age of 31. He had been in failing health for sometime.

Thomas Coon was born at Arnoldsville, NY on May 16, 1822. He moved with his family to Wisconsin where he was a public school teacher.

On Jan. 1, 1845, he married to Polly Crandall the oldest daughter of Paul and Sally Crandall.

In 1850, Thomas, his brother-in-law, Clarie Crandall, and three others came to Oregon where

they obtained land. Thomas Coon selected land on Silver Creek. In 1852, his wife and daughter, Cornelia, and the Crandall family arrived in Oregon. His father-in-law took up land adjoining the land of his son Clarke.

Thomas Coon taught the neighborhood school until failing health forced him to stop. He did not live long enough to see his son, Thomas Ray, who was born about three months after his death."

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

Hicks, Charles F. Dec. 26,1841 - Nov. 11,1926

Charles F. Hicks passed away Thursday, Nov.11,1926, at the age of 84.

He was born in Patriot, Ind., Dec. 26, 1841, a son of Frisby and Catherine Hicks. He was educated in the district schools of Iowa. In 1863, he offered his services to his country, enlisting in Company B, Fourth Iowa Independent Battery. Atthe close of the war he returned to the parental homestead, and the following year accompanied his parents and their family in the long trip across the plains. He labored with characteristic energy in clearing and improving the farm on which his parents settled near Silverton, and where with the exception of five years that he had charge of a grist-mill in Silverton, he had since resided. he was actively engaged in farming with his brother Philip, with whom he made his homestalls


