JAMES MCPHILLIPS 1827 - 1892 BERNARD MCPHILLIPS 1823 - 1903

The McPhillips and varients of their name were from Scotland. Many migrated in the 17th century when England wanted Ireland to be colonized by those friendly to the crown. The family of this story was possibly from the area of Strathclyde, Scotland and settled in Monaghan County in northern Ireland.

MONAGHAN

"Muineachain, Place of the thickets" was and is a lush and fertile area. The McPhillips were joined by other families from Scotland. McKenna, McMahon, McGowan, Smith, Finnegan, Duffy, Hughes, Markey, McArdle and others.

Our story begins with two McPhillips brothers who where born and raised in Monaghan County, Ireland. They immigrated to the United States about 1841-1842, at the beginning of the "great potato famine".

Bernard older of the two brothers, was born on Whitsunday [May 18] 1823. Bernard "having been apprenticed to a shoemaker when a boy, (he) saved enough money to pay his passage to this country. . .coming by way of the gulf to New Orleans."



James, shown in the above picture, was born in August 1827, "while still a boy he emigrated to this country."


Irish immigrants often found cheap passage to New Orleans because after: cotton ships unloaded their cargo in Liverpool, captains needed to load their holds up with human ballast for the return trip. We can only imagine what the conditions were like. After arriving "The brothers worked in and around New Orleans".

Bernard had been apprenticed to a shoemaker when a boy. He may have used this skill to earn his living while in New Orleans. About the same time a canal was being built through the city and Irish workers were employed to do the digging by hand. Whatever the means the industrious brothers worked for several years and had saved enough money to buy passage aboard the steamship *Ohio* after the discovery of gold in California. On February 28, 1850 they were bound for Chagres and the Isthmus of Panama.

Before the Panama Railroad was built in 1855, those wanting to cross the narrow strip of land did so on foot, canoe or pack animal. The way was treacherous, full of swamps, rivers, jungles and narrow mountain passes. Once they reached the City of Panama they had to board a crowded ship heading for California.

Why did the McPhillips brothers choose this dangerous route? "The voyage (to California) by way of Cape Horn will occupy on an average, five or six months, the trip is accomplished in as many weeks." Gregory's Guide for California Travelers via the Isthmus of Panama 1850. Our boys were in a hurry to make their fortunes.

James and Bernard worked in the mines for a few years, and after acquiring some wealth they returned east and purchased a "band" of cattle. Bernard drove his portion over the plains to California and sold them. Returning again to the east, he purchased another band in Iowa and drove them to Oregon, arriving November 1, 1852. James drove his portion across the plains over the Applegate trail to southern Oregon, "which proved to be a very successful venture, so much so that he repeated it, realizing a very handsome profit." In 1853 he was in the southern Oregon gold fields of the Umpqua valley in Jackson County. He may have been engaged in sluice mining on Sucker Creek that runs southeast of Cave Junction. The Oregon Statesman newspaper of Tuesday, July 12, 1853, noted that James McPhillips was elected Constable of Jackson County for the Sucker Creek precinct.

After reaching Oregon Bernard drove his herd of cattle north to Yamhill County and located in the upper Willamette valley and settled a donation land claim at the ..."headwaters of the Willamina." In October 1853 he filed for and received an Oregon Land Grant Claim of 160 acres (DLC #465, T5S R6W Sec. 9 & 10).

By September 1854 James had also arrived in Yamhill County. On October 15, 1854 he filed for and settled on an Oregon Land Grant Claim adjacent to Bernard (DLC #1881, T5S R6W W1/2 NW1/4 Sec 14 & E1/2 NE1/4 Sec 15).

The brothers barely had time to settle in when they found themselves fighting in the Yakima Indian War (1855 to 1856). James' widow received a widow's pension of eight dollars from June 27, 1902 until she died in 1929. Private James McPhillips, an Oregon Mounted Volunteer, served in the Washington Territory under Capt. James Williams of Co. N, 2nd Regt., and was said to have distinguished himself for bravery.

Bernard served under Captain A. J. Hembree's Company "E" 1st Regiment of Oregon Mounted Volunteers and was mustered in October 1855. He was assigned the duty of Quartermaster and served 206 days. The Original Quartermaster Records are held by his great grandson Jack McPhillips.

The war was an effort by the Inland Empire Indians, led by the Yakima Tribe, to keep the white men out of their lands, and was fought mostly in Washington Territory. The natives were defeated and accepted a treaty by which they surrendered ownership of their lands and moved to a reservation.

The brothers returned to Yamhill County and continued raising cattle. On May 4, 1857 Bernard and James became Naturalized Citizens at the Portland Oregon Territory District Court. Witnesses were Charles F. Shortridge, Wm F Agee, and Thomas Morris.

On a donation land claim northwest of the brothers lived Sarah Ann (Patterson) Cate and children. Sarah was the widow of John Thomas Cate who died March 14, 1856 and is buried in the Cate Cemetery on his claim. Sarah and John's children consisted of John Andrew, Mary Ann, Charles Russell, Sarah Jane, and Asa Finley. On April 19, 1857 Bernard and Sarah were joined in marriage by W. G. Lady, J.P. Sarah was born August 25, 1827 in Allentown, Monmouth County, New Jersey the daughter of John & Sarah Patterson. To this marriage were born James Oliver, Emma Olive, and Bernard "Arthur". Only Arthur lived to adulthood. James and Emma are buried at St Patrick's Catholic Church Cemetery, Muddy Valley, Yamhill County, Oregon.

Four years later James married Mary Ann Cate on October 10, 1861, the ceremony being performed by William L. Toney, J. P. Mary Ann was the daughter of Sarah Ann [Patterson-Cate] McPhillips, wife of James' brother. Mary Ann was born January 20, 1845 near Little Rock, Independence County, Arkansas. To this marriage were born Charlotte, John Emmitt, Rosa Ann, Charles Finley, Mary Jane, and Tressa May.

James and Bernard were partners in raising cattle on their donation claim properties. During the hard winter of 1861-62 they lost 500-600 head of livestock, "and only one scrubby heifer calf survived". Undaunted by misfortune they started out in the world again. They sold their claims and each purchased land southwest of McMinnville along the Old Sheridan Road, now Hwy 18. Their farms grew as they purchased more properties and their wealth increased.

JAMES MCPHILLIPS

On June 29, 1864 James and Mary received the Nuptial blessing by Father Weininger of Saint Patrick's Catholic Church. The couple farmed 500 acres of "choice farming land," on which they built a house in 1867. This land was originally part of the Cornwall Donation Land Claim. On 350 acres they cultivated grain, timothy, cheat, and vetch. About five acres were in mixed fruits and berries. The Masonville schoolhouse, built in 1860, stood on a triangular piece of their property until 1949. James loaned the use of the land, never donating it, to the McMinnville school district.



James was a member of the Masonic fraternity, blue lodge and the chapter, charter member of the McMinnville Grange; St. Patrick's Catholic Church (Bellevue area, where John Emmitt is buried) Yamhill county, OR. Toward the end of his life he suffered from paralysis due to a stroke, and his wife and son Charles, managed the large and valuable farm-business. He died December 23, 1892 at his home and was buried on Christmas Day, December 25, 1892. He was said to be a "man of uniform integrity of character and kindness of manner.

Mary lived in her home until May 25, 1929 when she died at the age of 84. She was a member of the Daughters of Hiawatha. Her grandson John Gale Wisecarver remembered her as "a gentle kind old lady who liked to sit on the porch and smoke a corn cob pipe".

James, Mary, daughters Mary Jane and Charlotte, and son Charles are buried in the family plot at the Masonic Cemetery, McMinnville.

BERNARD MCPHILLIPS

Bernard purchased considerable property SW of McMinnville including a part of the old Cornwall place and over the next several years added more land. His venture proved very profitable.

All was not well in his marriage to Sarah. In 1881 Bernard forced Sarah to leave their home with just her clothing and other items. Arthur drove her away to the home of her son Asa Cate. After bitter divorce proceedings, Sarah just wanted out of the marriage. October 10, 1884 the court records show "(1)...That Plaintiff (Sarah) shall take no decree for any property of Defendant (Bernard) or any interest therein but only for costs and disbursements of this suit and (2) That if a decree be granted, defendant shall pay an attorney fee to Plaintiff of \$50 and no more." Being without her own income, she lived with her son Asa Cate up Baker Creek Road, McMinnville and remained there until her death July 7, 1896. Sarah is buried in a large plot in the old section of the Masonic Cemetery, McMinnville.

In 1888 Bernard purchased land in Tillamook County that encompassed the beach from just south of Cape Kiwanda north to Tierra Del Mar. The site became known as McPhillips' Camp Ground. He grazed sheep in the hills east of the beach and as his grandson Barney said "tried to drink himself to death". Bernard remained there until he became ill and moved back to the valley to live with his son Arthur in McMinnville. Bernard "passed quietly away" on Sunday June 28, 1903 and is buried in the Catholic Cemetery in McMinnville.

HISTORY OF THE MC PHILLIPS CAMP GROUND

In 1888, Bernard McPhillips of McMinnville purchased an 80 acre tract that included Cape Kiwanda north to the Tierra Del Mar Beach, and east to Miles Lake. The area was covered with huckleberry that the early settlers picked to sell and to eat, and grass where Bernard grazed his sheep. The part located between the present Thousand Trails and the beach, was known as McPhillips Camp Ground (see photo, Cira 1896), and hundreds of people came in covered wagons to spend their leisure time. Miles creek that flows under the present fill furnished fresh water for the campers, who pitched their tents along its shady banks. As that was some time before the advent of the automobile, horses and covered wagons were the means of travel. In those early days, the town of Woods was the center of activity. It was there that campers were able to get any extra supplies, that they did not bring with them.

Remains of some of the old tables and benches could still be found along the camp site as late as 1961.

In March of 1961 Bernard's grandson Barney McPhillips of McMinnville donated a strip of land, 1 1/4 mile long through his property, to the County of Tillamook. This enabled the county to provide a new scenic road giving access to Pacific City and Tierra Del Mar beaches. Later the property west of the road was donated to the State of Oregon, and the property to the east sold to Thousand Trails, Inc.

The terrain of McPhillips Camp Ground has greatly changed since those early days, and instead of grass, a cool stream and huckleberry there are large trees throughout intermingled with rhododendron.





Bernard Marin Jos, an old picker, died at the home of his son, Arthur McPhillips, in this city Sunday morn-ing, June 26, 1903, from paralysis of the heart, 'nged 80' years. Mr. Mc-Phillips was born in Monaghan coun-ty, Ireland, in 1823. At the age of 18 he started for America, making his first stop, at New Orleans. After working several years in that city, Mr. McPhillips in company with hisbrother started for California. The following-year-they-returned to New-Orleans and bought a band of cattle and drove them to California, They soon returned an bought some more cattle and this time they came to Oregon and located hear Willamina where the deceased resided for several years. During the hard winter of 1861-62 they lost their entire herd of Cattle, about 600, and, becon ing discouraged, sold out and bought a place near McMinnville, which he owned at the time of his death.
