HISTORY OF THE JOHN FRANKLIN ADAMS FARM 150TH ANNIVERSARY

- 1833 John F. Adams was born in Jay, Maine.
- <u>1858</u> John F. Adams came west by taking an arduous ship journey to Panama, then traveling overland through jungle to the western Panama coast, where he took another ship to the Pacific Coast of Oregon, ending up in the Umpqua Valley. With monies earned from teaching school there and private tutoring he invested in livestock (mostly sheep). The area did not prove to be conducive to raising sheep as they suffered from ill health.
- <u>1865</u> He headed east in search of a better environment for his livestock and homesteaded in what is now known as Adams, Oregon. He purchased three pieces of property; Coldsprings/Holdman near the Columbia River was the winter pasture, Adams was the spring pasture and the mountain property was the summer pasture. The farm we own today was founded in 1865, making it 150 years old this year.
- <u>1878</u> John F. Adams married Susan Fry on December 17th in Indianapolis, Indiana. They had 5 children; John R., George H., Walter F., Pauline F., and Helen M.
- <u>1897</u> John F. Adams served as a county commissioner from 1897 to 1898, being elected on the Republican ticket.
- <u>1899</u> John F. Adams died in McMinnville, Oregon on March 20th. The family was living there so George could attend Linfield College where he was studying to become a doctor.
- <u>2015</u> Today there are 4 partners in the John F. Adams Farming Enterprise farm that consists of property at Coldsprings and Adams. John W. Adams, Joann Morrison, George Swanneck and Nancy Larson, and Lois Hartley Cannady.

BRIEF BIOGRAPHY OF JOHN FRANKLIN ADAMS

Note: The following article appeared in an Oregon newspaper on March 24, 1899 after the death of John F. Adams.

BURIED IN WALLA WALLA

Funeral of John F. Adams Held There Today Bank Officers Attend From Pendleton.

The funeral of John F. Adams was held in Walla Walla today, the body being brought from McMinnville to Pendleton and taken to Walla Walla on the morning train. From Pendleton went the officers of the Pendleton Savings Bank of which Mr. Adams was president; W.J. Furnish, cashier; T.J. Morris, assistant cashier; and the directors living here—Charles H. Carter, R. Alexander, E.P. Marshall and Joseph Basler. J.S. Teal, vice president, came from Portland.

Mr. Adams Career.

John F. Adams was one of the most prominent citizens of Eastern Oregon, and occupied a position of great prominence in this county. He was the founder of the town of Adams, 15 miles from Pendleton, where he had several hundred acres of the most valuable land of the county. His farm was noted as one of the best in this region, and to it he gave much of his time, although during late years he had extensive interest in connection with the handling of the large sums of money which he had accumulated.

During the years of 1897 and 1898, he served as a county commissioner, being elected on the republican ticket.

Mr. Adams was born and bred on the northeast, Atlantic coast, and was a native of the town of Jay, Maine, where he was born July 20, 1833. During his early youth he attended the public schools, and for two years was a student of the village academy in the town where he lived. His parents were Joseph and Areete Adams, who lived for the most part in Franklin County, Maine.

In the year 1858, he determined to come to the west, and, by the Panama route, came to the Pacific coast, going first to the Umpqua valley, where he

taught school for four years. The money thus received he invested in livestock, and it was this money that formed the foundation of the fortune, which is now estimated to be between \$75,000 and \$100,000.


For seven years he remained there, and then came to this county in 1865, engaging in farming and stock raising.

In 1878, he married Miss Susan F. Fry, a lady from Indianapolis, Indiana, who, with several children, survives him.

Mr. and Mrs. Adams have spent the past few winters in McMinnville, coming here to remain during the summer, and attending to their land and money interests in this section.

Mr. Adams was one of the men who assisted in the development of the state, and, like all the old pioneers, passed through many trying experiences. At different times, he was in danger of his life from the Indians, and both in Eastern and Western Oregon, witnessed the Indian wars that have become part of the history of this state.

Hi Andrea,

I'll try to look at a couple of things in our collections, but I don't think I'll find much. It will probably be Friday before I can do this.

A couple of other comments:

The certificate document (the one that is hard to read) was actually issued under the Timber Culture Act of 1873, a program that was similar to the Homestead Act of 1862 but obviously implemented 11 years later. The certificate is signed by Benjamin Harrison and seems to be dated 1892 at the bottom.

The other document, being in sections, is really hard to read, but it is clearly dated 1877.

My understanding of the homestead laws is that a deed would've been issued either after the settlers purchased the land or had settled and improved it for five years.

If we or the family cannot come up with some proof of the 1865 date, I would have difficulty recommending this farm for sesquicentennial status. The CF&RP has evolved since the Adams were designated a a century farm, and we have a higher burden of proof than in the early days.

ADAMS NOTES

Activities in That Town and Neighborhood Recently.

Adams correspondence in the Athena Press:

The mayor and council have set about cleaning up the town as regards its sanitary condition, and have thoroughly inspected every nook and corner, ordering under penalty a clean sweep of all filth and garbage. These orders if carried out, will surely have a beneficent effect upon the health of the community.

While there is much sickness in the community among the children, there are but one or two cases considered serious at present, that of the 13-year-old daughter of Mrs. King. The child contracted a severe cold at the time of the death of her father which has developed into an almost serious case of inflammatory rheumatism, and doubts are expressed as to her recovery.

There are many cases of la grippe among the grown portion of our citizens, but nothing serious. Several cases of lung fever, pneumonia, tonsillitis and one case of diphtheria, in a mild form.

J.F. ADAMS, DEAD

He Dies at McMinnville of Grippe and Cancer of the Stomach.

John F. Adams, a well known and highly respected citizen of Umatilla county, died at McMinnville, Yamhill county, at 1 o'clock this morning. The news came in a message from W.J. Furnish, cashier of the Pendleton savings bank, of which Mr. Adams was president, to T.J. Morris, Mr. Furnish being at McMinnville, having heard that Mr. Adams was seriously ill.

Mr. Adams had been ill two or three weeks of grippe, but the cause of his death was cancer of the stomach complicated with the grippe.

John F. Adams was one of the foremost citizens of this county, a man of means and character. He was born July 20, 1833. at Jay, Maine. He is one of the pioneers of Oregon. He leaves a wife and three children, and a brother, H.C. Adams, at Walla Walla. His remains will arrive in Pendleton on tomorrow's train and taken from here on the train, which leaves at 9:40, to Walla Walla where they will be interred. Friends of the family are respectfully invited to attend the funeral services and a special coach will be provided on the train for their accommodation.

The Pendleton Savings Bank will not be open for business tomorrow, Friday, on account of the death and funeral of J.F. Adams, the president

of the institution.

John F. Adams -- We have here the founder of the promising city of Adams, Oregon, which is located on the line of the railroad in Umatilla County. Mr. Adams was born in Franklin County Maine, in 1835. When twenty-two years of age, he came to Douglas County, Oregon, and for five years engaged in school teaching. Exchanging the master's rod for the shepherd's crook, he went extensively into the sheep business in the Umpqua Valley, and in 1865 transferred his flocks to Umatilla County. Here he lived twenty-three years. Besides the culture of sheep, he has devoted much time to cattle, and is now giving chief attention to fine horses. His stock of all kinds is of highly improved breeds. He is doing the county much service by thus improving its stock, and thus largely enhancing it's wealth. He is in truth, in every particular, a public spirited gentleman, greatly interested in all that prompts the mental and moral as well as material welfare of his town and county. He is one of the oldest settlers in the region, antedating nearly all those here; and it is much due to him that the place has attained it's present prosperity and eminence. He was married in 1070 to Miss Susan F. Fry. They have five children, three boys and two girls. Mr. Adams and his wife are now in their full vigor, and will see a development of this region which must eclipse anything which has yet been brought to pass within it's environs.






FARM RESIDENCE OF J.F.ADAMS, UMATILLA CO. OREGON.








Currently, CBARC operates on 143 acres that belongs to the Umatilla County. CBARC has been leasing an additional 40 acres from Mr. Adams for the past nine years. Last year, CBARC started leasing an additional 20 acres to meet its research needs in precision agriculture projects.

Mr. Adams would like to either sell the 60 acres of land or increase the lease price. Currently, the lease price is \$120/acre.

The additional 60 acres will meet our expanding needs for research brought with the hiring of a new weed scientist, agronomist/director, and a new plant pathologist. The 40 acres we have been leasing for 9 years have been in no-till (direct seed) for the last 9 years and do not have a history of small plot research, while the 143 acres belonging to CBARC has been under conventional till since 1930 and has been used for small plot research for several decades. The 20 acre piece has a variable surface and may be very good for precision agriculture projects. In fact, a recently funded project on precision nitrogen management will be conducted on this piece of land.

Overall, the additional 60 acres will expand research opportunities in transitional agricultural systems, precision agriculture, and direct seeding. I believe it will be a vital piece for maintaining and improving our services to the growers in eastern Oregon.

I hope the OWC will look favorably upon this land requisition and support it. Thank you and I look forward to your response.
